Year 5 Opportunity Class Placement Application for 2025

Opportunity classes are for primary school students who have high academic potential or who are intellectually gifted. They provide an environment where students can learn and make friends with classmates of similar ability. This can benefit a student's academic progress and wellbeing.

Opportunity classes are offered in Years 5 and 6, with parents/carers applying in Year 4.

Students who are successfully placed will usually have to leave their current school to enrol in a school with an opportunity class for Years 5 and 6. Opportunity classes are just one of the ways that we cater for our high potential and gifted students.

Testing and assessment

Applications for opportunity class placement are considered on the results of the Opportunity Class Placement Test. Students who wish to be considered for placement are required to sit the Opportunity Class Placement Test on Thursday 1st August 2024.

How to apply

Parents/carers must apply online between **Thursday 4th April and Monday 20 May 2024** at: https://education.nsw.gov.au/oc.

You must use your own email address and not one belonging to your child. Late applications are not usually accepted.

2025 School Enrolments

Kindergarten enrolments and all other enrolments for 2025 are currently being taken. In order for us to prepare our classes and ensure that equitable class numbers are maintained it is essential that we have all the information needed leading into 2025 as early as possible. News from Assistant Principal Curriculum & Instruction

The English K-10 curriculum emphasizes the importance of writing quality sentences that form well structured paragraphs as part of student's written text. There is an expansive number of concepts (see blue list) that students need to learn throughout K-6 to achieve rich written text. Each fortnight this term sentence writing concepts will be examined for parents and carers to gain a deeper understanding.

What is a 'simple sentence'?

A simple sentence is the most basic type of structure. It has only one independent clause and no subordinate clause. An independent clause is a group of words that has subject and a verb and can stand alone. On the other hand, a subordinate clause, also known as dependent clause, is a group of words that do not express a complete thought; hence, it can't be a sentence on its own.

A simple sentence has one (independent clause) and no (subordinate clause).

Here are some more basic phrases and commands that we are introducing with our students.


















Cough etiquette

Cover your cough



- When coughing or sneezing, use a tissue to cover your nose and mouth
- Dispose of the tissue afterwards
- If you don't have a tissue, cough or sneeze into your elbow.

Wash your hands



- After coughing, sneezing or blowing your nose, wash your hands with soap and water
- Use alcohol-based hand cleansers if you do not have access to soap and water

Remember hand washing is the single most effective way to reduce the spread of germs that cause respiratory disease.

Anyone with signs and symptoms of a respiratory infection, regardless of the cause, should be instructed to cover their nose/mouth when coughing or sneezing; use tissues to contain respiratory secretions; dispose of tissues in the nearest waste receptacle after use; and wash their hands afterwards.
